How to Use This Product

This is a Lotto game, a condensed version of BINGO.

- There are only eight spaces on each board to cover. You will find game boards containing the ritual symbols, sounds, and imagery of the holiday Rosh Hashanah, the holy, Jewish new year.
- You will find four game boards in nine different colors - the colors yellow, green, red, purple, blue, orange, taupe, magenta, and teal.
- Each color has four identical Lotto boards that are identical in idea, but differ as to imagery.
- Optional, apple game pieces are included, too.

GAME BOARD VARIATIONS

- The first board of each color is only pictorial.
- The second board of a color has only Hebrew text of those pictures.
- The third Lotto boards have the transliteration of those Hebrew words, to help anyone who is not a strong Hebrew reader.
- The last board of a color has the English meanings of those same words.
- For the English meanings, the caller will need to cut up cards of either Hebrew, transliteration, or the pictures.

DIFFERENTIATED FOR STUDENTS OR FAMILIES

By having the same idea on each game board of the same color, students of different learning levels, class, or family, can all participate in the same game round (differentiation). Preschoolers, and young elementary children will enjoy the pictorial boards. Older students who read Hebrew or are learning the Hebrew names of the concepts can use either the picture cards, or the Hebrew, or transliterated game boards. This also means, that if you have four players, and they all have the same color board, even if one has pictures, and another has Hebrew, and another has English, and another has the transliteration, they essentially have the *same* board, and will all win at the same time.

Materials and Game Instructions

1. Each player needs one colored game board, or an empty black and white game board that players fill in with eight different glued-on cards in the eight spaces on their card.
2. Players also need something to use for covering their board like beans, scraps of paper, plastic chips, etc...
3. The caller needs two pages printed and cut up (the page of 20 black and white cards, plus the page with the Kiddush cup; sorry it did not all fit on one page). The caller needs a container like a bag, hat, or basket to hold all 21 cards.

DIRECTIONS

The caller pulls one card from the container and shows the group. Each player searches the eight spaces on their card for the same concept (word or picture) and covers it with a token, marker, bean, etc.. The winner is the first player to get four squares in a row covered. Variations of the game include: Black Out, which means the entire board must be covered to win, not a line of four in a row; or Four Corners, in which a player who has the correct four corners covered is automatically the winner.

This is a very fun game for a synagogue's youth program during High Holiday services. The youth leader can make all copies ahead of time, pre-cut the game boards, and pre-cut picture cards or Hebrew words for players to glue, plus cards for the caller to call. When my daughter was in second grade, I had this game at the services in the children's room. Even though this was her fourth year playing this game at High Holiday services, when she saw me sitting at the computer revising this game, she exclaimed excitedly, "I love that game!" Your children, class, or shuls's youth program will enjoy it, too.

Do-it-yourself Rosh Hashanah Lotto

Directions to Assemble the Game Boards

Materials (included on the next six pages):

- Blank boards
- Picture cards
- Hebrew word cards
- Transliteration cards
- English meaning cards

Gather your own scissors and glue for assembly

- 1) Print as many blank game board grids as you need and cut the pages in half, as there are 2 per page.
- 2) Decide which cards you want players to use and make several copies to cut apart, or have older players cut apart their own, with a choice of: picture cards; Hebrew cards; transliteration cards; or English meaning cards. A light, colored paper for printing is a good way to cut light glare and help dyslexic readers.
- 3) Cut apart game boards and have players glue eight different cards onto their game board.
- 4) Decide which cards the caller will use and make one copy (the same as the players, or different). For example, players might have glued down Hebrew words, while the caller holds up a picture card. In this way, players must know the Hebrew names, and be able to read and find the Hebrew word on their board.

It is best to assemble the boards prior to Rosh Hashanah and not on the holiday.

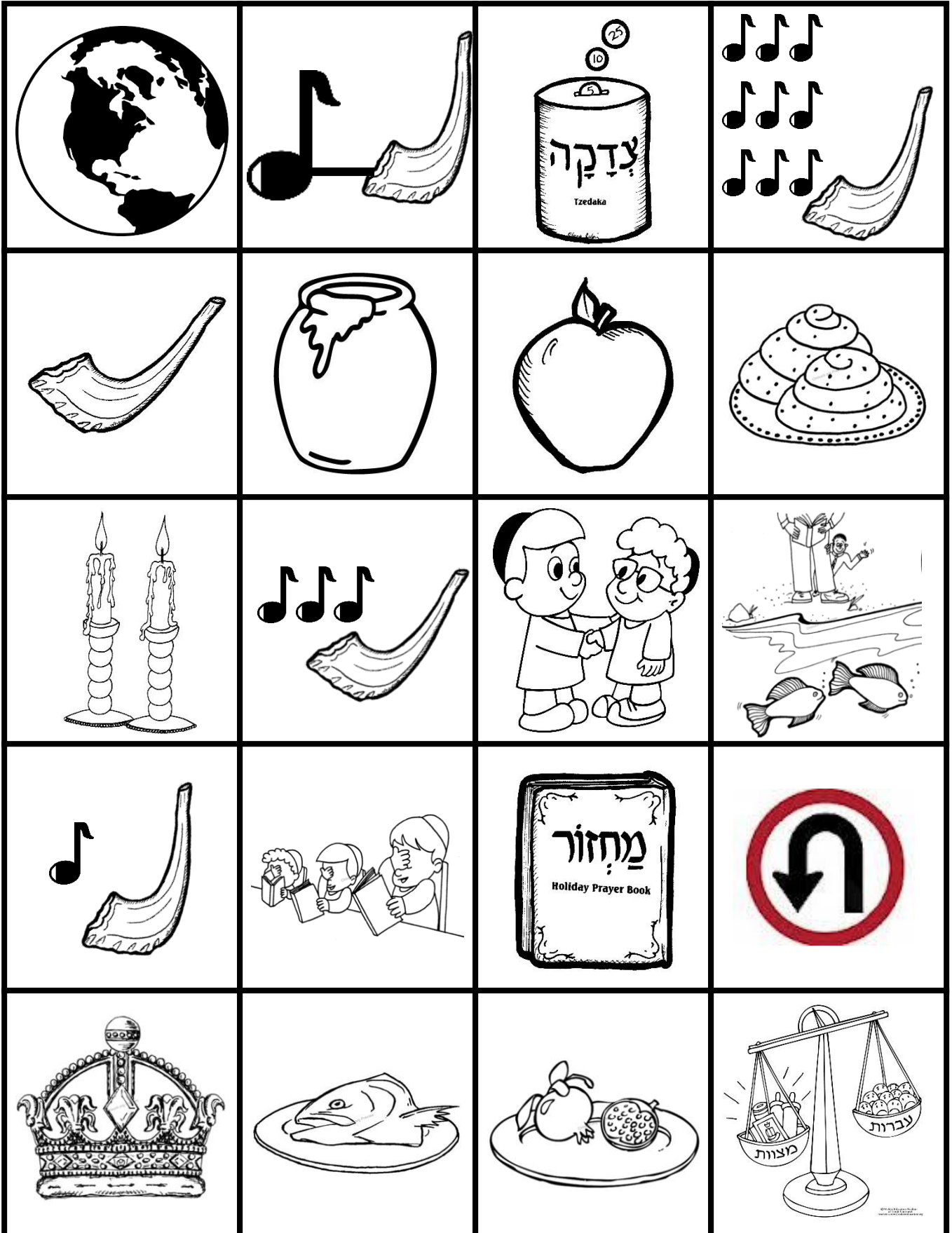
